Supplies:

- Large sheets of butcher paper
- Markers or crayons
- Yarn and fabric scraps
- Wiggly eyes, assorted sizes and colors.
- Safety scissors and glue sticks

Lay the sheets of butcher paper on the floor and have an adult use a black marker to trace around the outside of each child. Encourage the boys and girls to create his or her image within the shape using the materials provided. Print on the bottom of each paper doll "God Made You Special" along with the child's name.

Music

Supplies:

- Paper tubes, large jingle bells, chenille stems, masking tape, round oatmeal boxes with lids, markers and crayons, and stickers

Invite children to make an instrument.

- ⇒ The paper tube can become a horn that children can decorate with markers, crayons, and stickers.
- ⇒ Thread the large jingle bells unto chenille stems, taping the bells in place. These can become bracelets.
- ⇒ The oatmeal box makes a perfect drum to decorate and play.

Talk about different instruments we hear at church. God made each of us special and we can make a joyful sound that is pleasing to God. Jesus did lots of special things. We can please God as we make a joyful noise with our instruments.

Art

Supplies:

- Cardboard piece
- Glue
- Crayons

Ahead of time, at least the night before, print the word Bible on the cardboard piece. Use a thin line of glue to outline the letter on the word and allow to dry overnight. Research the Hebrew spelling and make one of the Hebrew also.

Place the Bible word cardboard piece on a table with paper and crayons. Encourage children to lay the paper over the word Bible and use the crayons to make a rubbing of each word. Explain that in Bible times Hebrew was the language Jesus read. Compare the two. Talk about what the Bible says.
